Acts 17:1-4

Now when they had passed through Amphipolis and Apollonia, they came to Thessalonica, where there was a synagogue of the Jews. Then Paul, as his custom was, went in to them, and for three Sabbaths reasoned with them from the Scriptures, explaining and demonstrating that the Christ had to suffer and rise again from the dead, and saying, "This Jesus whom I preach to you is the Christ." And some of them were persuaded; and a great multitude of the devout Greeks, and not a few of the leading women, joined Paul and Silas.

Acts 17:5-9

But the Jews who were not persuaded, becoming envious, took some of the evil men from the marketplace, and gathering a mob, set all the city in an uproar and attacked the house of Jason, and sought to bring them out to the people. But when they did not find them, they dragged Jason and some brethren to the rulers of the city, crying out, "These who have turned the world upside down have come here too. Jason has harbored them, and these are all acting contrary to the decrees of Caesar, saying there is another king— Jesus." And they troubled the crowd and the rulers of the city when they heard these things. So when they had taken security from Jason and the rest, they let them go.

Acts 17:10-15

Then the brethren immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea. When they arrived, they went into the synagogue of the Jews. These were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so. Therefore many of them believed, and also not a few of the Greeks, prominent women as well as men. <u>But</u> when the Jews from Thessalonica learned that the word of God was <u>preached by Paul at Berea, they came there also and stirred up the</u> <u>crowds. Then immediately the brethren sent Paul away, to go to the sea;</u> but both Silas and Timothy remained there. So those who conducted Paul brought him to Athens; and receiving a command for Silas and Timothy to come to him with all speed, they departed.



1 Thessalonians 1:1

"Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,
To the church of the Thessalonians in God the
Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ."

1 Thessalonians 1:2-5

"We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers, remembering without ceasing your work of faith, labor of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ in the sight of our God and Father, knowing, beloved brethren, your election by God. For our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Spirit and in much assurance, as you know what kind of men we were among you for your sake."

The Doctrine of Election Greek: ek-log-ay'

I. The act of picking out, choosing A. of the act of God's free will by which before the foundation of the world He decreed His blessings to certain persons

B. the decree made from choice by which He determined to bless certain persons through Christ by grace alone

1st Use: Acts 9:15

But the Lord said to him [Ananias], "Go, for he [the apostle Paul] is a <u>chosen</u> vessel of Mine to bear My name before Gentiles, kings, and the children of Israel."

Saul called Paul in Scripture

Acts 13:9

Then Saul, who also is called Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked intently at him...

1 Thessalonians 1:6-8

"And you became followers of us and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Spirit, so that you became examples to all in Macedonia and Achaia who believe. For from you the word of the Lord has sounded forth, not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place. Your faith toward God has gone out, so that we do not need to say anything."

1 Thessalonians 1:9-10

"For they themselves declare concerning us what manner of entry we had to you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, even Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come."

Context Matters!!

What is Paul talking about when he says "wrath"?

Context Rule:

"What did they think?"

The Apostle Paul always taught using the OT Scriptures. They were the foundation of his instructions to the church.

Wrath in Hebrew: זעם or za'am Ist use: Palm 38:3

There is no soundness in my flesh
Because of Your <u>anger</u>,
Nor any health in my bones
Because of my sin.

Zephaniah 3:8

"Therefore wait for Me," says the Lord, "Until the day I rise up for plunder; My determination is to gather the nations To My assembly of kingdoms, To pour on them My indignation, All My fierce anger; All the earth shall be devoured With the fire of My jealousy."


Paul is laying the doctrinal foundation for the church being rescued from the "wrath of God" coming upon the whole earth, also known as the 7-year tribulation.

Revelation 6:15-17 The Sixth Seal

And the kings of the earth, the great men, the rich men, the commanders, the mighty men, every slave and every free man, hid themselves in the caves and in the rocks of the mountains, and said to the mountains and rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of Him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb! For the great day of His wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"

Romans 5:8-9

But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him.

For you also suffered the same things from your own countrymen, just as they did from the Judeans, who killed both the Lord Jesus and their own prophets, and have persecuted us; and they do not please God and are contrary to all men, forbidding us to speak to the Gentiles that they may be saved, so as always to fill up the measure of their sins; but wrath has come upon them to the uttermost.
